

"Night Must Fall" by Emlyn Williams was first presented at The Duchess Theatre in London in May 1935 with the author playing the part of Danny, It was an instant success and has since become a classic of the thriller repertoire. It has been performed on countless occasions over the years, most particularly by amateur companies many of which have chosen to up-date the play to the present day, but it is a play essentially of its period. Domestic or private murders somehow had a greater aura of mystery and drama in the twenties and thirties and this play is as redolent of its time as the actual crimes which were headlines in the Sunday newspapers of the day.
