The dates of this play will be October 27th, 28th, and 29th .

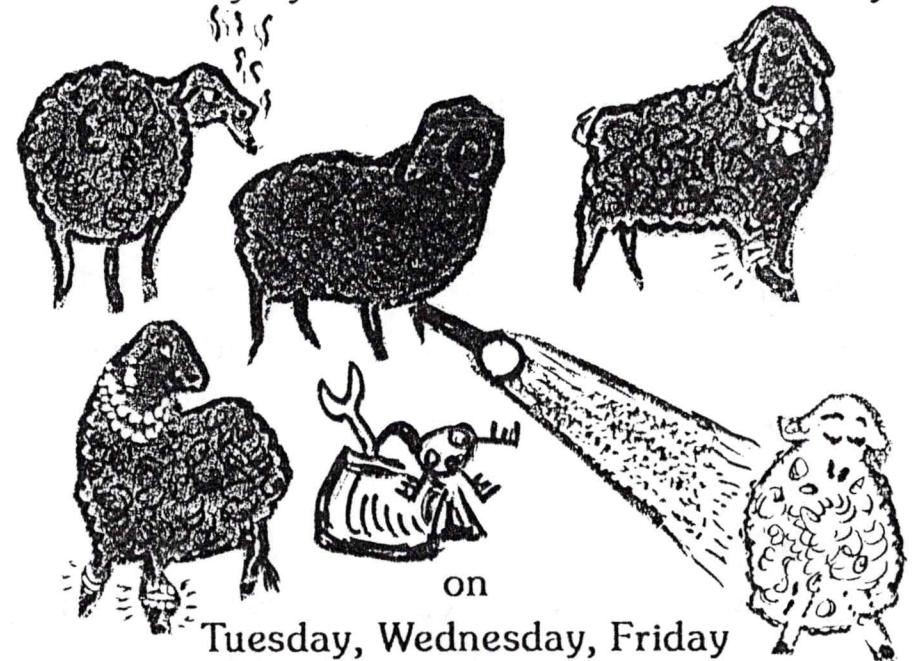
