We are very fortunate to have a new play written for us by Andrew Davies, lecturer in English and Creative Writing at the University of Warwick. He is well known as a children's writer (Conrads War and the Marmalade Atkins series) and as a playwright for stage and television. Among his many television credits are adaptations of novels by R. F. Delderfield, To Serve them All my Days and a number of original works including BBC2's highly successful serial A Very Peculiar Practice.


