

Silas Marner

Written by George Eliot in 1860, this wonderful fairy tale is an accurate observation of rural life over the period 1790 to 1820.

The narrative deals with the journey through the life of Silas Marner, a weaver, who is wrongly accused of theft, and finally expelled, from a strict religious group in Lantern Yard, near Manchester. He suffers from a trance-inducing illness and it is during one of these 'visitations' that he is framed by his friend William Dane, who later marries Silas's ex-fiancée Sarah.

We then join Silas some 15 years later after his expulsion. He moved from Lantern Yard to Raveloe, a small village in Staffordshire. He lives alone in a stone-pit cottage and spends his life weaving linen for the local gentry. He accrues a large amount of cash from his trade and, despite warnings from well meaning visitors, he finally falls victim to a robbery.

Silas however is rewarded for his loss by the timely arrival of a 3 year-old, flaxen haired girl, Eppie, who, he believes, was delivered by divine forces, to replace the gold he has lost.

The child, as it transpires, is in fact the natural daughter of Godfrey Cass, the squire's son, and his estranged wife Molly, who on reaching Silas's cottage with the child, dies from exposure exacerbated by opium abuse.

This secret is kept by Godfrey for 16 years until it is discovered that his elder brother, Dunstan, was in fact the thief that took Silas's gold all those years ago. Only to be thwarted in his wicked deed, by falling in to the local water-filled stone pit, where he perished and lay undiscovered until the pit was drained of water.

Godfrey then sees fit to tell his wife Nancy of Dunstan's foul deed and, more to the point, that he was Eppie's real father.

Overcoming her shock, Nancy, though having lost a child of their own, feels it only right to approach Silas, and take Eppie in to their home.

Only Eppie can decide, and the love for her 'Adopted Father' and her husband-to-be Aaron, finally helps her to make the final decision.....
